College Credit Plus (CCP) at Edison State

The **College Credit Plus (CCP)** program provides eligible students with the unique opportunity to enroll in college courses at post-secondary institutions. The purpose of the program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wider variety of options to high school students. Participating students earn college and high school credit concurrently, accelerating their college careers and reducing the time and cost of attendance after high school.

Ready to Get Started? Follow the Steps Below:

CCP Admission Procedures

SUBMIT Letter of Intent: Students must submit a **Letter of Intent** to their high school before **April 1**. This letter informs the school district of the student's intent to participate in the CCP program for the following school year. Letters of Intent are distributed by the school district. See your high school guidance counselor for additional information regarding the Letter of Intent.

APPLY to Edison State:

Prospective CCP students must complete the online CCP application to gain admission to Edison State Community College. If planning to complete the Accuplacer Assessment, the application must be submitted two weeks prior to testing. Returning CCP students are not required to reapply.

Take the Accuplacer Assessment **OR** submit qualifying ACT or SAT scores.

A Register to take the Accuplacer Assessment. Submit your high school transcript at your assessment appointment.

B If you have qualifying ACT or SAT scores, send scores and high school transcript to:

Register and attend a **MANDATORY CCP** orientation:

New CCP students are **required** to attend new student orientation. At orientation, students will learn about valuable resources, receive their student ID, and gain valuable information regarding Edison State policies and procedures.

Explore How to Qualify...

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility to participate in the CCP program is determined by state guidelines. Students must meet college-ready benchmark standards in at least one subject area or meet additional qualification standards to be eligible to participate in CCP.

COURSE ELIGIBILITY

Edison State course eligibility is determined by assessment scores, prior course work, and additional course prerequisites. Students will be notified of general course eligibility after the submission of assessment scores and high school transcripts. Students must meet all course prerequisites.

Register for Classes!

After completing the admissions process, students should follow Edison State CCP course registration procedures to enroll in courses for each semester of participation.

Students must submit course registration forms, with their guidance counselor's signature, to sign up for Edison State courses offered on campus, online, or available at select high schools. It is important that students consider their high school calendar, including summer and holiday breaks, to ensure they have adequate time to meet with their guidance counselor to complete the registration form.

NEED ADVICE?

Edison State advising services are available at both campuses to help students establish an academic plan and select courses.

ONLINE COURSES?

Students interested in taking online courses through Edison State must complete the XLN 100s Online Readiness Workshop. The workshop runs for one week and is completed online using the Blackboard web-based classroom. Students must complete this workshop with a 70% or better to be eligible to enroll in online courses.
